Mr. Brown was hired by the Charlotte White Center as its Director when it opened in Dover-Foxcroft in 1979. In February of 2015, he celebrated his thirty-fifth anniversary as the Chief Executive Officer for this comprehensive social service and health care agency serving adults and children facing such life challenges as intellectual / developmental disabilities, mental illness, acquired brain injuries, physical handicaps and elder age related issues. Mr. Brown has overseen the growth of the agency from a small non-profit serving fifteen people with four employees in 1979 to a multi-level, multi-dimensional agency providing over one hundred long term partnerships for residential care and serving over twelve hundred individuals and families annually with a staff of four hundred and fifty skilled employees.

Mr. Brown holds a Master's Degree in the Education of the Severely Handicapped from the University of Maine. He is a Licensed Clinical Professional Counselor, Certified Rehabilitation Counselor, and has been affiliated with Mayo Regional Hospital and other providers for over thirty five years as an EMT-Paramedic.
